David Vann's Retirement as a Trustee

The Sir Henry Royce Foundation was created from a discussion at the 1995 Federal Rally of the Rolls-Royce Owners' Club of Australia that a stand-alone body be created to preserve the past in relation to items manufactured by Rolls-Royce and Bentley, the history of the Founders (Sir Henry Royce, The Hon C. In 1996, when the Trust Deed was formally executed, David was appointed a Trustee and has served continuously since that time. David was the Chairman of Trustees for a number of years. His leadership was critical in the establishment of Bill Allsep House.

At a dinner in Melbourne on September 10 David was feted for his services to The Foundation by his fellow Trustees and Members of the Victoria, NSW and Queensland Branches.
